



BlueCoat Proxy SG

Using SSH, Telnet or the Console

For this procedure you will be using the Command Line Interface (CLI) of your Blue Coat Web Security/Filter device using an SSH client (such as OpenSSH or Putty), Telnet or through the console port. We would recommend using either SSH (for remote connections) or using a direct connection to the console port. Telnet provides no encryption of the communications and therefore your authentication credentials and configuration would be vulnerable if a malicious user were to monitor your connection.

Connect to the Blue Coat Web Security/ Filter using your favourite SSH client, Telnet or a direct console connection.

1. Connect to the BlueCoat Proxy SG using your favourite SSH client, Telnet, or a direct console connection.
2. Logon using your administration authentication credentials.
3. Execute the following CLI command and capture the output (possibly using the cut and paste facility):
 - a. "show configuration"
4. Save the captured output to a file and remove any visible page lines (i.e. --More--).
